Choosing a topic

1. A problem of theoretical interest to field of personality
2. Of interest to you!
3. Can be straight correlational,
prefer if experimental with an individual difference parameter

Requirements

1. Systematic review of the literature
 - What is the current understanding of the problem?
 - What has been done before
 - What problems have been detected
2. Proposed research technique
 - Method and procedure
3. Expected results (how to analyze them)
 - What are they expected to be if your hypothesis is right –
 - What are some of the alternatives

Proposal requirements

1. Abstract
2. Introduction
 - Literature review
 - Hypothesis
3. Methods and Procedure
 - What is to be done
 - What instruments will be used
 - Who are the subjects
4. Expected Results
 - How will the data be analyzed
 - What do you expect to find if your hypothesis is correct
(Include a graph of expected results)
 - What are alternative possible results
5. Discussion
 - What would the results mean if they turn out they way you expect

Searching the literature

1. Science does not occur in a vacuum
Current research reflects the contributions of previous studies
“I can see so far only because I stand on the shoulders of giants” (Newton)
2. Published results have been reviewed by peers and judged to make significant contributions

Searching the literature: The web is your friend

1. Read current articles in reputable journals
2. Search for articles based upon keywords in their abstracts (PsychInfo)
3. Search for articles based upon the previous work they cite (Social Science Citation Index as found in Web of Science)
4. Google Scholar

Multiple sources are available

1. Searching books
 - limited current but of historical interest
 - Many references are irrelevant
2. Searching journal articles

Journals

1. Not all journals are equal
 - Quality of peer review
 - Breadth of distribution
2. General APA, APS journals –
 - Psychological Review
 - Psychological Bulletin
 - Psychological Science
3. Field specific
 - Journal of Personality and Social Psychology –
 - European Journal of Personality
 - Journal of Research in Personality
 - Personality and Individual Differences
 - Personality Science
 - Journal of Personality

Searching with Google Scholar

1. Search for keywords of interest
2. Examine the abstract of the article
3. Look for the recent citations to that article
4. Rinse and repeat

Bibliographic management

1. Commerical bibliographic managers
Endnote (free to NU students)
2. Open source bibliographic managers
BibTex (BibDesk is the Mac Implementaton)

Bibliographic management

1. For short papers/projects, just copy the citation information into Word/TexShop
2. For longer papers/projects it is worth learning how use and build a data base
 - Using Endnote (talks with WORD)
 - BibTex talks with Latex
